We invite you to say hello to your neighbor, to move your body, breathe in and out freely in this shared space, hoot and holler when you feel called to, and to engage in the transformative and community-building experience of live performance!

FESTIVAL DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Welcome to SpringDance 2024, I am thrilled to have you here with us to witness the power dance has to "speak", in ways words are unable. To have you here with us, in shared space, is a true gift.

The Dance Program at SSU is invested in shaping student-centered learning experiences for dancers to seek their potential and be in their full agency, identities and bodies — unapologetically. Spring Dance 2024 is a STUDENT-CENTRIC CONCERT: student-led, student-designed, student-created, student-performed, student-managed. As director of this show, my goal was to practice "moving back," so that the students could "move forward", and co-create a learning sanctuary that centered the intelligence of the body with shared power and leadership. We made many decisions as a collective, and the students continued to push me to expand my ideas of what teaching and facilitating a learning environment could look like in 2024. They continued to share their perspectives in a way that enlightens my ideas of dance, higher education and the world. I am so grateful for all that they have taught me—I am inspired by them every day.

We have a cast of ten choreographers and close to thirty performers participating in Spring Dance. They are a community of students from all over campus, representing a diverse array of identities, dance heritages and academic disciplines. They are committed to supporting one another in the process of emerging as artists. Some performers are on stage for the very first time, and some choreographers are seeing their work on stage for the very first time. Spring Dance features three lighting design students who have crafted the artistic look of five dance pieces in collaboration with the choreographers. The other dances were collaboratively designed with CPA professional staff.

The students work collaboratively in embodied scholarship and research through reflection, feedback, dialogue, writing, improvisation, choreography, performance, practice, study and PLAY! Each student choreographer has created a dance piece that speaks to; who they are, the visions and ideas they are investigating, the dancers who are in the room with them, and the movement that brings meaning and sensation to them and their collaborative cast. It is their artistry and creative practice that you will witness in this performance, we applaud their bravery and generosity in sharing their work with us all.

A huge thank you to the Department of Theatre Arts & Dance's faculty, staff and student design, production and publicity teams that have supported these artists in making their visions come to life. It takes an incredible amount of work and dedicated time to put a show together, and it literally could not happen without every single collaborator. The cast and I are in deep gratitude and awe of their excellence and teamwork.

I am so appreciative of the students' hard work in the rehearsal and production process and the community of care they have cultivated in tending to each other this semester. They have leaned into the messy, worked to trust the process and embraced courage over perfection. Every single student that has worked on this production is a STAR! They ALL are remarkable individuals, and it has been a gift to be on this journey with every single one of them as: makers, performers, designers, stage managers and crew—on and off stage.
